


Photography and science in defense of an environment on the verge of globally significant climate change











The Project

"On the Trails of the Glaciers" is a photographicscientific project conceived and developed by Italian photographer Fabiano Ventura in collaboration with a specialized technical and creative team and an ad hoc international Scientific Committee.

The project, combining analytical photographic comparison with scientific research techniques, pursues the aim of analyzing the effects of global climate change studying the collapse of the Earth's largest mountain glaciers.

Methodology

Through a series of expeditions to the world's longest mountain chains, the project team takes glaciological measurements and shoots high definition photographs at the same time of year and from exactly the same spot where photographers and explorers took photographs in the late 19th and early 20th Centuries.

The photographs are realized with large format film cameras in order to obtain the best overlap with historical images, the best resolution quality and guarantee their documentary value.

Scientific Purposes

Climate and environmental changes have given rise to the rapid disintegration of huge glacial masses with environmental consequences which are still not completely understood. Combining documentary and scientific approaches, the project aims to gather unique data on the recent dynamics of glacier movements and on the state of health of test case glaciers in Karakorum, the Caucasus, Alaska, the Andes, the Himalayas and the Alps.

Communication Purposes

Through an original fusion of innovative scientific research and comparative photography techniques the project aims to contribute to the general public's understanding of issues such as:

The importance of sustainable development and the conservation of the world's natural resources, in particular water resources:

The importance of biodiversity;

The role of scientific research in raising awareness and understanding of environmental issues;
The restoration and safeguarding of photographic archives, recognizing their value as historical and cultural heritage.

Past Expeditions

The initial three expeditions were to Karakorum (2009), the Caucasus (2011) and Alaska (2013) with all the mission objectives being met in terms of data collected, comparative photography and in communicating the scientific significance and purpose of the project to a wider public.

Future Expeditions

With the same objectives and operating methodology the upcoming expeditions are at various stages of the planning process: Argentinian and Chilean Patagonia during the winter of 2015-2016 to further the TEMATIC scientific project (TEsting Methods And Techniques for Investigating the Cryosphere); the Himalayas in 2017 and the Alps in 2019.

Documentaries

During each expedition the SD Cinematografica Film Production Company made a documentary in the "On the Trails of the Glaciers" series. The first two documentaries produced to date have been broadcast by TV companies including ZDF, ARTE, RTSI, RAI and NHK.

Exhibitions

The travelling exhibition which accompanies the project displays over 60 large-format comparisons of new and archive photographs and includes an interactive video installation with a 4x3 meter screen and modern and vintage camera equipment displayed side by side. The exhibition has been hosted by internationally important museums and institutions such as the Messer Mountain Museum in Firmian (Italy).

Financing the Project

"On the Trails of the Glaciers" is financed through public and private bodies; income from the sale of information content produced by the project; and backing received from commercial and technical sponsors who share the project's core values.


